

2019 Carolinas PGA Hall of Fame Criteria

Purpose: To enshrine PGA Professionals into the Carolinas PGA Golf Professional Hall of Fame in recognition for their enduring accomplishments and historically significant contributions to the game and the PGA of America.

Automatic Nomination for Election Ballot:

- All Carolinas PGA Section Past Presidents in good standing
- All Carolinas PGA Section Golf Professionals of the Year in good standing
- Any Carolinas PGA Section Past Executive Director
- Any Honorary Carolinas PGA Section Member

Nomination from the Membership:

- Any Carolinas PGA member in good standing (living or deceased) can be nominated
- Any non-Carolinas PGA Member (living or deceased)

All automatic and new member nominations must meet the following criteria:

Nomination Criteria (PGA Member):

- 1. PGA Member (in good standing) 20 years or more
- 2. Carolinas Section Member (in good standing) 10 years or more
- 3. Can be elected posthumously
- 4. Recognition by the section as a leader and promoter of the game and the PGA image
- 5. Contributions to the PGA of America and the game of golf must be enduring and best exemplify the complete PGA Professional

Nomination Criteria (Non-PGA Member):

- 1. Involved in golf in the Carolinas 20 years or more
- 2. Can be elected posthumously
- 3. Recognition by the section as a leader and promoter of the game
- 4. Contributions to the game of golf must be enduring and best exemplify a "Hall of Fame career"
- 5. Must be retired from the position that made them a Hall of Fame nominee

Selection Committee: The selection committee will be comprised of: two (2) current CPGA Board Members, the three (3) most recent CPGA Hall of Fame inductees, two (2) at-large CPGA Members, two (2) CPGA Past Presidents, and one (1) non-PGA at-large member, all to be appointed by the non-voting chairperson

Selection Process: The nomination process will go live on Monday, July 1. Friday, July 19 at 11:59pm EST, is the last day to complete the electronic nomination form. More detailed nomination forms will then be sent to the nominees to be returned by Wednesday, August 1. The Hall of Fame ballot will be sent to the committee in early August and a preliminary ballot is due back to Section Headquarters by Friday, August 16. Following a preliminary call with the committee, final ballots are due to Section Headquarters immediately following, by Tuesday, August 20. The Hall of Fame inductee will be the one candidate receiving the highest vote totals and who appears on at least 2/3 of all ballots cast.
